


Ducks & Lions: Trauma Sensitive Resources (D&L) partners with schools and school districts to become Certified Resilient School Communities. Schools and districts achieving Resilient School Community Certification are verified to have fully implemented the Trauma Informed Schools Model by training all staff members in Realizing the prevalence of trauma, Recognizing the impact of developmental trauma on learning and behavior, Responding in a trauma informed way, and Resisting retraumatization by ensuring a culturally competent school community. Schools must have on-site teams of staff members who are individual Trauma Focused Specialists, and to have 3-5-year strategic plan in place for continuing the work.


Attainment of Resilient School Community Certification is typically achieved over a 2-3-year period and requires that the following criteria be met.


- 1. A Resilient School Community audit is conducted by D&L staff.
- 2. A four- to six-person Resilient Schools Lead Team is established and in place at each school.
- 3. All staff members have participated in an overview training of the Resilient Schools Model with training delivered either by D&L staff in conjunction with the Resilient Schools Lead Team members.
- 4. All members of Resilient Schools Lead Teams have been trained in the four Rs of the Trauma Informed Schools Model and have achieved individual certification as Trauma Focused Specialists.
- 5. All staff members have been trained in four Rs of the Trauma Informed Schools Model with training delivered by D&L staff or Lead Team members.
- 6. There is a Trauma Informed School Plan in place for each participating school. Each plan was developed by the school Lead Team under direction of D&L staff. Each plan provides for implementation of the Four Rs Schools Model, continuation of the model over time, and measurements of ongoing success of implementation efforts.
- 7. Implementation of the Model and compliance with all school and/or district certification requirements (Items 1-6 above) verified by D&L staff.
- 8. Certification is awarded for two years and may be renewed by biannual verification of all certification requirements by D&L staff.


